#### What is Forbearance?



- Forbearance is the capacity to endure hardship or inconvenience without complaint or protest. Forbearance is being long-suffering, patient, resigned, tolerant. So, forbearance means showing restraint in the face of provocation. Forbearance requires keeping oneself in check and controlling oneself. This means holding back or abstaining from expressing all our reactions.
- Forbearance also means forgiving any harm done toward us. There is nothing extraordinary about returning good for good, but doing good in return for bad that is an extraordinary quality.

## The Story of Joseph



- Joseph was the second youngest of twelve brothers born to Jacob, who was called Israel. Israel loved Joseph more than any of his other sons because he had been born to him in his old age, and he made an ornate robe for him. When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than any of them, they hated him and could not speak a kind word to him.
- One day, Joseph traveled to check on his brothers while they were watching their sheep. His brothers plotted against him, threw him in an empty well, and later sold him as a slave to some traveling Midianites. Applying animal blood to his "ornate robe," they returned home and made Jacob believe his son had been killed by wild animals.
- In the meantime, Joseph was taken to Egypt and sold to the captain of the guard, Potiphar, as a household slave. Joseph was later falsely accused of cheating and thrown into prison. While in prison, Joseph accurately interpreted the dreams of two of Pharaoh's servants, who were also incarcerated. Later, Pharaoh had a disturbing dream no one could interpret. One of the servants Joseph had previously helped then suggested to Pharaoh that Joseph could interpret the dream. Joseph was summoned from prison, and he interpreted Pharaoh's dream in such a powerful way that he was appointed second-in-command over Egypt.

## Story (contd.)



- Pharaoh's dream predicted seven years of famine. During the famine, Joseph's older brothers came to Egypt to buy food. They did not recognize Joseph, now twenty years older, and he was stern with them, pretending that he thought they were spies. Joseph kept one brother in prison until the others brought their youngest brother, Benjamin, back to Egypt to prove they were not spies. They brought Benjamin with them on a return trip, and Joseph revealed himself to his brothers. They were shocked, yet soon glad to be reunited. Joseph sent word for the entire family to join them in Egypt until after the famine.
- Later, when their father, Jacob, died, Joseph's brothers feared that Joseph would take revenge against them for their prior treatment of him. They came to Joseph and begged for his forgiveness, appealing to a request their father had made before he died. Joseph wept when he heard their appeal. Revenge was the last thing on his mind. Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."

#### The Story of Muhammad

## What is Integrity?



 Integrity is living according to the laws of nature and the rules of right action.

It means having thoughts, words, and actions aligned.

## The Story of Integrity



In May of 2005 American professional tennis player Andy Roddick was playing Fernando Verdasco, of Spain, in the round of 16 at the Italia Masters tennis tournament in Rome, Italy. Roddick was the number one seed in the tournament and a heavy favorite to win the match and advance.

Roddick, one of the top players in the world, was at the top of his game. Indeed, just one month later he would make it to the finals at Wimbledon before losing to Roger Federer.

Roddick dominated as expected and had triple match point when something extremely unusual happened. Roddick couldn't return Verdasco's hard second serve but the linesman called the serve out and awarded Roddick the point and the match.

With the crowd cheering Verdasco ran to the net to shake Roddick's hand and congratulate him on his victory. However, Roddick knew something that the linesman, the umpire, the cheering crowd, and Verdasco himself didn't know. The serve had not been out, but had hit on the line, making it in. Roddick could have kept this information to himself and accepted the victory. Indeed, honor calls are not expected in tennis. Instead, he informed the umpire that the ball had been in and offered to show him the mark on the clay where the ball had hit to prove his point.





## Story (contd.)

The umpire reversed the call and awarded the point to Verdasco.

Having been given a second chance Verdasco made the most of it. He came back to win the game, the set, and the match giving him a highly improbable victory, especially considering not long before he had been standing at the net ready to concede.

Sportswriter Frank DeFord estimates Roddick's honesty cost him at least "tens of thousands of dollars;" perhaps much more if he had gone on to win the tournament. Integrity was clearly more important to Roddick than either winning or money. Andy Roddick lost a tennis match that day but won something much more important, and in the process set a great example of sportsmanship for competitors everywhere.

#### What is Determination?



- Determination refers to firmness of purpose; resoluteness.
- A determined leader does not allow opposition or trouble or initial defeat or anything else to disrupt the course of action they have decided to pursue without making a total effort to succeed.
- Winston Churchill famously counseled determination to a group of schoolboys with the words: "Never give in. Never give in. Never, never, never, never—in nothing, great or small, large or petty—never give in, except to convictions of honour and good sense. Never yield to force. Never yield to the apparently overwhelming might of the enemy."

## The Story of Determination



Greta Thunberg was born on Jan 3, 2003 in Stockholm. She was about eight years old when she first heard about climate change. Thunberg found it "too unreal" that no one was doing anything about it and, at age 11, fell into depression. Her revolution started at home with her parents, opera singer Malena Ernman and actor Svante Thunberg. When Thunberg first approached them with her idea of school striking, they were not supportive. "They did not support the idea of school striking and they said that if I were to do this I would have to do it completely by myself and with no support from them," Thunberg said.

Later she was diagnosed with Asperger syndrome, obsessive-compulsive disorder and selective mutism. In her talk at TEDxStockholm, she said this means she "only speaks when (she) thinks it's necessary – now is one of those moments". "I overthink," she said in an interview with The Guardian earlier this year. "Some people can just let things go, but I can't especially if there's something that worries me or makes me sad. She recalled that when she was younger, she would cry when teachers showed her class films of plastic in the ocean and starving polar bears.

In May 2018, Thunberg won a climate-change essay competition for the Swedish newspaper *Svenska Dagbladet*. That was the genesis of her activism career. Three months later Greta launched the "Fridays For Future" movement — or School Strike for Climate (as it says in Swedish on her now-famous sign), encouraging students to skip school to demand action on climate change from their governments.

## Story (contd...)



That November, when she was in ninth grade, Thunberg staged a two-week strike outside the Swedish parliament, demanding that her government cut emissions by 15% a year. Her activism lead her to camp outside of Swedish Parliament holding a sign that said "Skolstrejk för klimatet" which translates to "School Strike for Climate." She had skipped school to protest climate change.

Today, 18-year-old Greta Thunberg is an inspirational person for students who want to reduce the effects of climate change. She has also convinced her family to start lowering their carbon footprint by adopting a vegan diet and giving up air travel, which also meant her mother had to give up performing internationally. She still spends every Friday on strike; Thunberg is on week 72, according to her Twitter.

In 2019, Greta was named Person of the Year by Time Magazine in recognition of her work as a climate change activist. In an interview with the magazine, she said concerning the importance of environmentalism, "We can't just continue living as if there was no tomorrow, because there is a tomorrow."

Greta's actions have shown that every single person has an important role to play in society. There are plenty of things you can do to make an impact, regardless of your age.


